

At a work session of the Charlotte County Board of Supervisors held at the Administration Building on June 3, 2021, at 9:00 a.m.

Supervisor Pierantoni gave the Invocation.

Chairman Walker called the work session to order.

Scott Frederick with VDOT addressed the Board. Mr. Frederick reviewed the roads currently listed on the six-year plan. Eureka Mill Road has been completed and Whites Chapel Road has been started. Mr. Frederick stated any money allotted for a certain road not used is rolled back into the County's funding and will be used for the next road project on the list. Mr. Frederick stated the funding for this year is \$270,000.

Mr. Frederick provided a traffic count for roads listed on the six-year plan and made the Board members aware they can choose the order they would like the roads to be repaired on the six-year plan. The link for the traffic count can be found on the VDOT website. The public hearing for the six-year plan will be Monday June 14th at 6:05 p.m.

Mr. Frederick took questions from the Board after reviewing the six-year plan.

Being no further questions for Mr. Frederick Chairman Walker proceeded to the work session with Rob Taylor with RiverStreet.

Rob Taylor with RiverStreet addressed the Board. Mr. Taylor received questions previously from the Board members and proceeded to review those questions and the answers he provided. Mr. Taylor provided a Power Point presentation showing the number of locations to be served within a six year period and the total funding over a ten year period. The Power Point provided maps showing the CAF II award project areas, the RDOF 1 award project areas, and an overlay of the two project areas within the County. Mr. Taylor reviewed funding opportunities to cover the budget shortfall with State and Federal grants to expand the current network sooner and to more residents. Mr. Taylor requested \$1,150,000 in local match for a VATI grant application, that is due in the fall of 2021. The funds requested would be from the ARP funds the County received.

Mr. Taylor took questions from the Board after presenting his Power Point presentation.

Being no further business, the work session was adjourned.
